Abstract

Every compact group admits a countably additive invariant probability measure – the Haar measure. We will see that the existence of a mean on a group – a finitely additive invariant probability measure – is a much weaker condition, but still allows allows us to draw some striking conclusions about the group. In particular, we will look at the existence of a mean and of almost-invariant subsets, and of the impossibility of a Banach-Tarski-type paradox for such groups.
