## Abstract

The game of Sylver Coinage is a simple game: two people are in charge of the mint for a new country. They alternately mint positive integer valued coins. However, they may not mint a coin value that is redundant (if 5 and 7 have been minted, then 19 may not be). The game persists until one person is forced to mint the coin of value one (and then loses). This raises some natural questions: How long can this game take? Who wins? What is their strategy? In this talk, I will explain how all of these questions are basically intractable and what partial results are known.
